The year 2013 was a hectic but great year for Nul-Kryds!

We hosted the 66th annual NTHS congress in the spring and participated in the planning and execution of an excursion to Singapore together with the Section for Fluid Mechanics, Marine and Maritime Technology at DTU Mechanical Engineering. Of course we also held the traditional Martha summer party and the notorious Christmas lunch.

The NTHS congress was a great success. We have received overwhelmingly positive feedback from the participants and it would seem that we have reached our goal of presenting the fact that the Danish maritime industry is broad, adverse and certainly not dying out.

Nul-Kryds also continued the efforts to increase interest in studying maritime technology at DTU. This was one of the purposes of holding the Singapore Excursion and also the reason for having the Tech Event. This has been a focus area of Nul-Kryds for the past couple of years, and it would seem that it is starting to bear fruit. Attendance to the maritime courses is at a long-time high and at the Christmas lunch we had more than 30 participants.

In 2014 we will shift some of our focus to providing more direct benefits for the members of Nul-Kryds. This could be through more company presentations, establishment of a Nul-Kryds library of supplemental textbooks and more social events. We also plan to hold an evening course in the use of NAPA software package. A new international excursion is already planned from the Section and Nul-Kryds will most likely be involved again this year.

Finally, I would like to express our gratitude for the support Nul-Kryds receives from the sponsoring companies and foundations. Without this support, financial as well as the interest and willingness to engage in cooperation in our various arrangements, it would be impossible to fulfill the purpose of Nul-Kryds.



Resumé of the General Assembly

After the Presidents presentation the accounts were presented by the Vice-president in the absence of the Treasurer. The accounts were reviewed and accepted by the members present.

A proposal to make minor changes to the articles of the association were made and accepted. The changes were minor and primarily the make the articles up to date. For instance the meeting time and location of the board was made more flexible and the requirement for participation in the introductory party removed as such a party is not known anymore.


Finally, the election of the new board was performed. There was a limited number of applicants present, and the result by voting became as shown below.


NTHS 2013 in Denmark

It also serves as a great opportunity to get to know the exchange students studying maritime engineering here at DTU.


This combination of participants provides a great opportunity for all to expand one's network, both social and professional.


NMME Social Visit


Words from the president (from the official DTU report)

In the end of October the recruitment campaign World Careers (a part of the Danish Shipowners Association) held the annual Tech Event. Also this year Nul-Kryds participated as a partner in the event. The purpose of the Tech Event is to increase interest and focus on the area of maritime technology among engineering students. Also this year the event was a great success. A number of interesting companies participated; Maersk Maritime Technology, Force Technology, OSK-Shiptech and Principia North to name a few. The event attracted about 70 interested students.




This year, the event was scheduled a little differently. After a short presentation from the company representatives a number of case sessions were held. The students could then go to the presentations they found most interesting. At the presentations the company would present an actual problem or project they had solved. The presenters had been asked to make the presentations technical and not just about the company facts. This sparked a great interest from the students.

After the first case session it was possible to walk around the fair area and talk with the company representatives at their respective stalls, thereby deciding which company to follow during the second and last case session. The final presentation was held for all participants and was about the educational possibilities and offers at DTU within maritime technology. In this context also the President of Nul-Kryds was on the podium and presented the union; what it is, who it is and what benefits of joining are.

Finally, the day concluded by another round of networking at the job/project fair and the possibility of a freshly cooked hotdog.

Christmas Lunch and Paperboat Competition

The traditional Christmas lunch took place on November 16th. The Christmas lunch is one of the most important social events, which assembles both present and former members of Nul-Kryds. This event serves the purpose of creating friendships and improving networks between students and people already working in the industry. This year, 25 present and former Nul-Kryds members attended the festivities, which consisted of a traditional Danish Christmas feast including Meatballs, Roasted Pork, herring, Ris a la mande and of course the mandatory snaps.




The glorious annual Paper Boat Design Competition was held just before the Christmas lunch. This year the paper boats were not build days before the event. Instead participants designed and build paper boats before the competition while enjoying a glass of Glögg and discussing the optimal design strategy with the other contestants.

The Paper Boat Competition is a yearly recurring event, which has been running for more than 10 years, with one very simple objective; the contestants must build a paper boat with a lightweight not exceeding 10 gram, and the contestant with the highest deadweight to lightweight ratio is crowned the winner. Additionally, to secure maximum safety and aesthetics of the paper boats, following strict rules and regulations applies:

- The ratio of length to breadth must be larger than 2
- The midship section coefficient must be less than 0.95 for all draughts
- The half angle of entrance of the bow must be less than 30° at all draughts

The deadweight/lightweight ratio is determined, by loading the paper boat with sand until the ships sinks due to lack of buoyancy or structural failure.

The winners of the Paper Boat Competition 2013 was:

- 1st Aleksander Hamdan

- 3rd Christian Råe Holm & Martin Frederiksen

The winners were rewarded, besides eternal glory in Nul-Kryds, with a bottle of quality snaps, a Nul-Kryds mug and a diploma.



Trip to the new Maritime Museum of Denmark

In one of the first board meetings after the general assembly on October 1st several possible activities for the members of Nul-Kryds were discussed. One of these was a group excursion to the new Maritime Museum of Denmark in Elsinore. The idea was immediately popular, so a bus for around 15 persons was organized and the event was advertised thru a poster and facebook/intranet. We met around 12 o'clock Saturday November 30th and after a little refreshment-shopping the bus departed for a nice afternoon in the dock of Elsinore's old Shipyard.

The trip offered interesting modern architecture, but also a good look into maritime history from hanseatic heydays, over triangular trades, navies of the world wars, and forth to contemporary topics like the Maersk's new triple-E class.

The museum has clearly become more modern since the days, when it still was located in Kronborg castle. Not only the architecture with slightly sloping floors which guide the visitor thru the exhibitions, but also many audio posts where visitors for example can listen to tales from the seven seas produce a nice maritime mood. Another good feature that could be mentioned is a computer game, which simulates merchant shipping in the 18^{th} century. The mission of course is to earn money, but on the journey the visitor gets to see many exhibits that tell stories about life back in those days.

After a couple of hours in the museum, we had a quick bite to eat at a local hotdog stand, and a beer in the bus. We returned home at around 5 o'clock in the evening.


